### Course prerequisites

This course requires a reasonable level of physical fitness.

It is recommended that candidates are 14 years in the calendar year they undertake the course.

In addition to this, candidates attending an update course must hold the current HLTAID003 Provide first aid Statement of Attainment prior to attending.

### Validation period

The First Aid Statement of Attainment is valid for a period of 3 years and CPR Statement of Attainment is valid for a period of 12 months.

### Course competencies

Successful completion of this course will result in the award of Provide First Aid:

- + HLTAID003 Provide first aid
- + HLTAID002 Provide basic emergency life support

### Online learning

Online learning is required for candidates on blended courses and must be completed prior to attending the face-to-face component of the course. Useful hints and tips include:

- + Disable your pop-up blockers to allow the online learning content to launch quickly and easily.

### My USI

### Course assessment

If you are unable to demonstrate the necessary requirements, you will be given the opportunity to attend another course at no cost to retrain and be reassessed on the particular skill or area of knowledge.
